

# Multi Language Setup

## Overview

M5 supports two additional languages within the base application:

- Canadian French – FR-CA
- Spanish – ES

This allows organizations to create and maintain descriptions for the job-related code definitions in two alternate languages of their choice.

Code-related Multi Language frames are:

- Job Visit Reason Multi-Language
- Notification Manager Multi-Language
- Part Catalog Multi-language
- Part Failure Codes Multi-Language
- Position Codes Multi-Language
- Product Main Multi-Language
- System/Assembly Multi-Language
- System Codes Multi-Language
- Visit Reasons Multi-Language
- Work Accomplished Codes Multi-Language

## Setup and Configuration

The actual language(s) are configured within the M5 Parameter CODE\_LOCALE\_IDS.

To configure multi language settings, navigate to the M5 Parameter Maintenance frame and select **LOCALIZATION** from the dropdown menu.

Enter the values with a semi-colon between as shown in the example below:

Param Name	Param Value
CODE_LOCALE_IDS	FR-CA;ES



Earlier versions of M5 may not contain this updated version of the M5 Parameters frame that allows you to update the parameters within the application itself. If your version of M5 does not allow for this functionality, you must contact your AssetWorks Project Manager or M5 Support to initiate assistance to updating the new M5 parameter values.

After you have configured the parameter settings and the corresponding values on the frames listed above, the actual language M5 uses for the description will be determined one of two ways:

1. By matching the **browser language** with one of the two languages specified in the parameter setting.

OR

2. By the **Override Locale** setting (if set) on the user's Application Maintenance record. If set, this value will override the parameter settings.

For each code entity you want to define multi language descriptions for you must navigate to that specific multi language frame (as listed on the first page) and set description values for each code that you wish to display.

The example above shows the Part Catalog Multi-Language frame. After you have loaded the part number data, you can define descriptions for Canadian French and Spanish as shown above.

M5 will then look at the **browser language** setting and display one of those descriptions if the language matches the M5 parameter values for FR-CA or ES.

But if the Application User record has an **override locale** value set, M5 will use that to determine what description to display.
